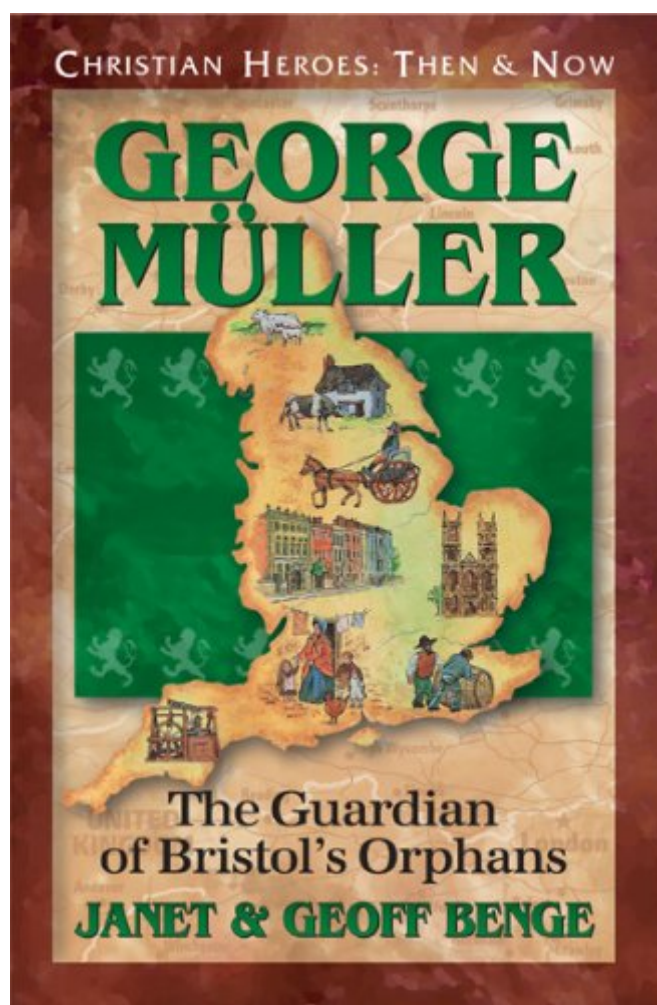

Time after time we see the amazing power of righteous prayer. George Muller put the character of God to the test big time, and every time He showed how faith can move mountains. An amazing life lived in God. The book itself-a real page turner. And perfect for believers and non-believers.

This book was extremely well-written and easy to read. I could hardly put it down until I finished reading it. I found it to be very inspiring and very encouraging for a Christian who desires to increase their own faith. I must humbly admit that if I had 1/100th of the faith that George did, I'd be doing much more for the Lord than I currently feel capable of doing. I doubt that any Christian could read this book and not feel a sense of urgency in their own Christian walk to work on further developing and exercising their own faith. It's humbling to see a man such as George with such a simple and yet such powerful faith. I told my husband about the book as well, and he used it as a read-aloud for our 6 children ages 3 - 11 before bedtime. Most of them really enjoyed it (especially the beginning when George was still quite a bad young man!) They enjoyed listening to the way God transformed George into such a man of faith. I believe this book can have a lasting impact on children and adults, and help remind us of God's transforming power. It's incredible how George changed from a sly sinner to a willing servant with such a great, albeit simple, faith in His creator. I would encourage all Christian families to add this book to your own home library of inspiring Christian books!!

The authors do a great job with their storytelling abilities. I often tell people of George Muller's faith and simple godly practices that have stuck with me since the first time through the book.
