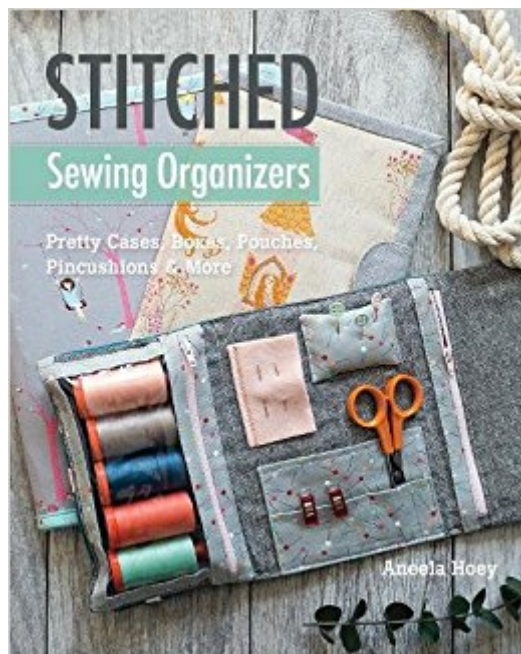

Artist and fabric designer Hoey (Little Stitches) is known in the sewing world for her cute, quirky designs. In this project collection, she provides patterns and instructions for organizers in a variety of styles, from simple needlebooks and pincushions to zippered pouches and totes. Some of the projects will be familiar to sewists with experience in bag making, while others, such as the triple pouch, present a new spin on storage. Though the organizers are designed to store sewing supplies, they're not limited to that purpose, making them useful gift projects as well. It features 15 adorable projects that'll keep your sewing space in great shape, or would make the perfect gift for your quilting bestie or a project swap. There are projects for your sewing studio, including needlebooks, tape measure covers and fabric boxes; but there are also a heap of pouches, totes and folios that will help you keep portable projects and your hand sewing kit organized. Aneela includes lots of know-how when talking about the specific materials and supplies, which of course include

interfacing and fleece, needed for the projects. The basic techniques section is comprehensive, so there's no need to be daunted by the detailed finishes on the projects. The only problem with this book is deciding which projects to make first! (Make Modern, 17) The answer to the non-sewer's question "How many sewing organisers do you need?" is 15. These quick and adaptable projects are designed to fit inside one another to bring order to your unruly supplies, while teaching new skills! (Sew Magazine, August 2017)

I love to knit and embroider, and these accessories are fun to sew and they make keeping your supplies organized much easier. (Plus they are all just so darned cute!) Most of the projects are somewhat challenging---you are working with vinyl, zippers, etc., but you can customize them to fit your needs and you can make them all in coordinating fabrics so they are all matchy-matchy. Buying products made to store your needlework projects in are usually very expensive for some reason, and you can make the projects in this book for a lot less money. You can also modify the organizers so they can be used to jewelry storage when you travel or make them for your kids to carry small toys in.

I've made a few of Aneela's patterns before, so when I saw she had a book I bought it. I tried out two of the patterns in the first week and I'm addicted. The See-It-All pouch is already a favorite that is perfect for organizing small sewing supplies, make up, cables, etc. I've made six already with plans for more. The instructions are clear and the hand-drawn illustrations are easy to understand. Plus, the variety in project complexities makes this a great book for a beginner sewist who is interested in trying out pouches and other organizers.

I love Aneela Hoey's patterns and so happy she published this book! The items in here are very useful and even a beginning sewer can make them. I liked all the patterns and if you like pretty things to organize your sewing and even knitting stuff, this book is it.
