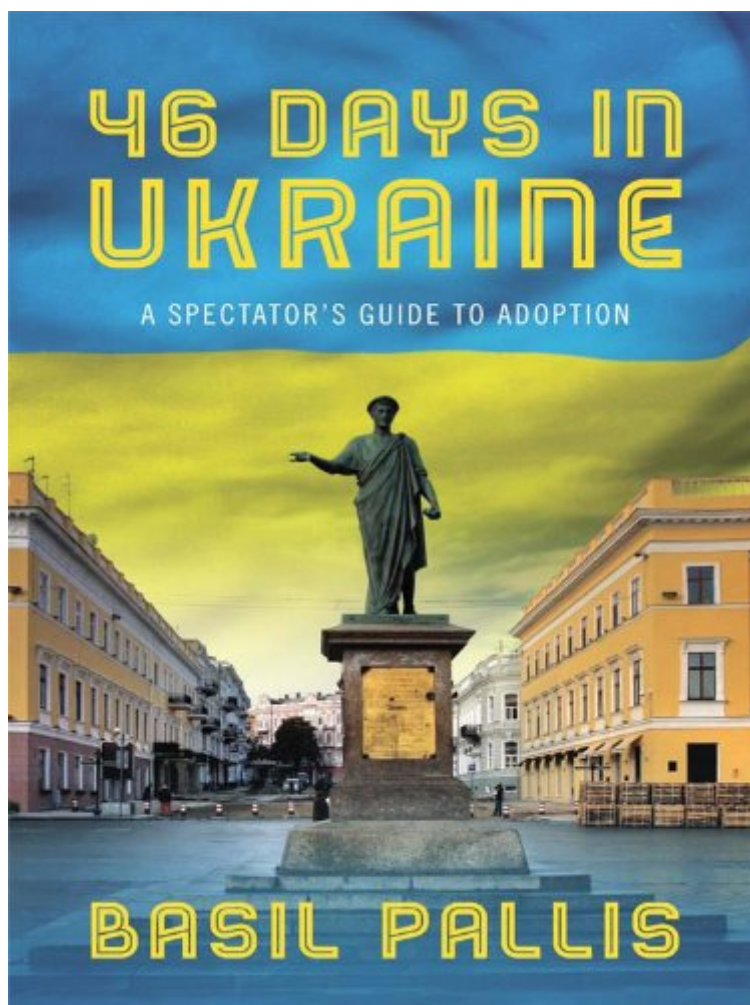


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46 Days In Ukraine: A Spectator's Guide To Adoption

The author Basil Pallis and his wife Rita embark on a five year road of fostering, then adopting three children from Ukraine. Their journey is not for the faint of heart. The Ukraine adoption process is a quagmire - stupefyingly slow and mired in mountains of red tape. Through it all, Pallis tells a riveting and humorous story. The pages turn and I finished this book in one sitting. This heartwarming tale of their ups/downs and the helpful team of people from Ukraine who, finally, help the Pallis' bring their munchkins home is a must read for anyone considering adoption in Ukraine!

This is a wonderful book. It is the first-hand account of an American couple's trials and tribulations adopting in the Ukraine. It is part travel log, part diary, and part love story--but most of all, a story of the triumph of the human spirit. The 49 days in the title are the final part of the much longer saga of Basil and Rita's entire Ukrainian adoption process. The story is told with wit and charm, in the style of the best travel writing. Right up there with the travel writing of John Steinbeck and Lawrence

Durrell. This is not your average "here's what happened to me" book. It's also a real page turner. Setback after setback, fighting blizzards and bureaucracy, Basil and Rita keep jumping up and dusting themselves off--until the next chapter, when another unforeseen calamity awaits them. Their patience and persistence are tried again and again, making the final victory so sweet. There are places in the story that remind me of the old Saturday morning serials at the movies. At the end of one episode, the hero has surely fallen off the cliff. But wait! The next episode reveals that at the last second he was able to grab ahold of a small bush. He didn't fall after all! Part of the charm of the book is the author's infectious sense of humor, always finding something to be amused with at even the most trying of times. There are indeed many "funny parts." But there is much to be absorbed as well--besides learning about the arcane Ukrainian adoption process. The descriptions of the city of Odessa for example, are full of vivid images and juicy historical tidbits. This slim volume is a great read. I am delighted to recommend "49 Days in the Ukraine" to any lover of a good story well told.

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
