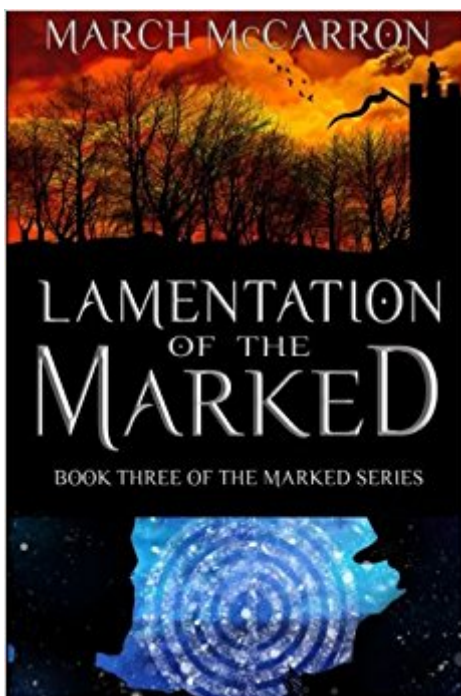

The only real weakness (and it's very minor, and sometimes humorous) is the fall back to terminology from our modern world in her new fantasy world (I almost lost it when she referred to someone using a "thermos"). Great characters, very moving and gripping story line. I found myself in tears more than a few times.

These books are well written. The characters have clear voices. The plot pulls you along... You actively want to know what happens next. It's hard to put the story down. Even though this part of the story had some very sad moments in it, there were heart warming and empowering bits, too. I appreciate that each emotion is handled deftly. I felt the emotional aspects of the story powerfully, but they weren't heavy handed and I didn't feel like there was a lot of wallowing in those moments.
